God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. John 3:17



THE DIGNITY OF THE HOMELESS

The parking lot didn't look so bad at first. Then, I walked across it to an open door. The man inside didn't look so bad either until I stepped into the semi darkness. As my eyes adjusted the smell hit me first. What I saw was worse than any experience I had had in third world gettos: rotting food, broken plumbing (read non-existent), and piles of unrecognizable sludge everywhere. The man turned out to be Russian, "Russian," he said. "You look..." as he led me the five steps to the bathroom. "TV, radio, no work...no work...long time." The shock was almost unbearable. This was my own country. What was worse, I could see a young mom with kids out of the corner of my eye in the next door motel room.

I think about that experience today especially as I plan dinner tonight and the meals we will serve tomorrow for brunch after mass. I can cook on a stove, place food in the frig, turn on the TV to watch a ballgame, and lock the front door. We have the key to the house, car, church, office, our children's houses, etc. So many places we belong, with a key to show it. And for all of us, we have an indoor bathroom that we can access every night. But this Russian man, under those extremely stressful conditions, the mom next door, is it possible that wrong decisions are made a lot and sometimes decisions that have terrible consequences for themselves and their families? I wonder if this should be a motivation to act and act decisively on many fronts: with personal acts of kindness, as a parish community, and politically for the homeless and indigent.

GOD'S MERCY

Today's reading from the second book of Chronicles contains a sort of "mini-history" of Israel. It highlights God's mercies in choosing Cyrus the Persian to be an instrument of deliverance when the people were in captivity in Babylon. Despite their sinfulness and the deserved punishment they were undergoing, God's mercy was lavished on the people in the form of a miraculous act of liberation.

The Letter to the Ephesians, in much more theological terms, gives a similar account of a God "who brought us to life with Christ—by grace you have been saved." The author stresses that it was when we were "dead in our transgressions" that God saved us, an act of pure grace. He emphasizes that it is not our own efforts that freed us from sin ("this is not from you"); rather, "it is the gift of God." This, of course, is the heart of the entire Pauline corpus, that salvation comes to us by faith in God's mercy, revealed in the death of Jesus. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

Scripture

- ... from that day on, the spirit of the LORD rushed upon David. (1 Samuel 16:13)

- "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in Him?" What is your answer?

When we pray we should occasionally cup our hands and hold them open before God. This gesture represents the openness of a heart ready to be trusted and filled by God's loving presence. Identifying with the humble and the poor Jesus, Francis opened His hands and heart. He became a beggar like the ones he saw along the wayside, and trusted completely in divine providence.


