#### **The Church Structure**

St. Anthony's style is cruciform and has proved functional in this time of the energy crunch in that the Guadalupe Chapel section is heated and cooled independently of the main section. Also, Baptisms, Marriage, Penance, and Funeral ceremonies, prayer group meetings and choir rehearsal can be held in either the Guadalupe or the main wings without overlap or noise interference with other ceremonies that are held almost simultaneously.



#### SAINT ANTHONY'S CHURCH

The concept of the church building being visible sign of God's presence has its roots deep in the past, when the Jews wandered for forty years in the desert. Standard instructions were to put up the Lord's tent in the center of the encampment to represent "The Lord living among us." This tent was superior in its furnishings to all other tents. The Lord's tent, from which we get the word "tabernacle" housed the Ark of the Covenant, containing the Ten Commandments, the staff of Aaron, and a jar of Manna. St. Anthony's Church, therefore, proclaims "The Lord living among us."

The total cost of the main church building, with furnishings, was eight hundred and fifty thousand dollars. The building is solid concrete construction, representing the power, strength, and majesty of God. The windows are constructed to take advantage of the sunlight without the heat. The same concrete construction was used in the famed Coventry Cathedral in England, which, we are told cost twenty-five million dollars. The windows in St. Anthony's are a special fringe benefit, only being visible when you leave the church to go out into the world.

The Cupola, in everyday jargon referred to as the skylight, has as its purpose "to point to God and bring in the light coming from God." The architect, Mr. James J. Nargis, explained, "We want people passing to know that this is a church. We want them to realize that the purpose of a church is to point them to God and to the sacrifice Christ made on the Cross for us all. We want to lift people's vision, hopes and spirit." Sometimes we are so busy looking down that we only see the dust at our feet, we need to lift our eyes and spirits, too.

The tabernacle opens on both sides, to the Guadalupe Chapel and main wing side. This makes it accessible for private devotions and also for distribution of the Holy Eucharist.

The altars in both the main wing and the Guadalupe Chapel are constructed of Sierra White Granite, cut from the foothills at Raymond in Madera County, California.

The pews have been constructed to give ample space for the congregation's comfort. Bishop Willinger requested a large sanctuary for possible future ordinations in our diocese. The sanctuary lends itself equally to other celebrations such as the children's Mass, First Communions, Religious Education services, religious concerts and large wedding parties.

Immediately behind the Main Altar is the replica of the Last Supper, which we hope is a visual aid to recall the First Mass, "which started it all." Saint John's Seminary in Camarillo has the original Last Supper design executed by the artist, Senor Ballester, in Valencia, Spain which was constructed by two artisans who showed up at the site of a new Catholic church which needed a cross in the village of Limpias in the 1700's. They took an oak log and some leftover planks from the church construction site and went to work behind a tarpaulin for two weeks. When the crucifix was completed and unveiled at the church dedication, the two artisans had disappeared without asking for payment. The people marveled at the craftsmanship and the figure of Christ, still living, his head raised, mouth opened slightly and eyes lifted to Heaven. The original crucifix has been the subject of much devotion related, in part, to the fact that on Fridays, especially Good Friday, the mouth is purported to fill with blood.

The three paintings over the Last Supper, are done in Byzantine Romanesque style. The Romanesque gilt softens the harsh, straight lines of the Byzantine art. These paintings are favorites with our Orthodox friends. The painting on the left depicts Our Lord as a child in the Holy Family, learning the trade of His foster father, Joseph. The central image is the Risen, glorified figure of Christ, here to remind us of His power and love for us. On the right of the main portrait of the Risen Lord, is the painting depicting Mary, assumed into heaven, and crowned Queen of Heaven and Earth. The full symbolism of the Trinity is embodied here with God, Our Father, and Christ, the Son, depicted next to Mary with the Holy Spirit shown as a dove above her.

#### Sociedades y Organizaciones Continúa

El estilo de St. Anthony es cruciforme y ha demostrado ser funcional en este momento de crisis energética en el sentido de que la sección de la Capilla de Guadalupe se calienta y se enfría independientemente de la sección principal. Además, las ceremonias de Bautismos, Matrimonios, Penitencias y



Funerales, las reuniones de grupos de oración y los ensayos del coro se pueden llevar a cabo en el Guadalupe o en las alas principales sin superposición o interferencia de ruido con otras ceremonias que se realizan casi simultáneamente.



El costo total del edificio principal de la iglesia, con muebles, fue de ochocientos cincuenta mil dólares. El edificio es una construcción sólida de hormigón, que representa el poder, la fuerza y la majestad de Dios. Las ventanas están construidas para aprovechar la luz del sol sin el calor. La misma construcción de hormigón se usó en la famosa Catedral de Coventry en Inglaterra, que, según nos dicen, costó veinticinco millones de dólares. Las ventanas en St. Anthony's son un beneficio adicional especial, ya que solo son visibles cuando sales de la iglesia para salir al mundo.

La cúpula, en la jerga cotidiana conocida como el tragaluz, tiene el propósito de "apuntar a Dios y traer la luz que viene de Dios". El arquitecto, el Sr. James J. Nargis, explicó: "Queremos que la gente que pasa sepa que esta es una iglesia. Queremos que se den cuenta de que el propósito de una iglesia es señalarles a Dios y al sacrificio que Cristo hizo en la Cruz por todos nosotros. Queremos dar vida a la visión, las esperanzas y el espíritu de las personas". A veces estamos tan ocupados mirando hacia abajo que solo vemos el polvo a nuestro paso, también necesitamos dar vida a nuestros ojos y espíritu.

El tabernáculo se abre a ambos lados, a la Capilla de Guadalupe y al lado del ala principal. Esto lo hace accesible para devociones privadas y también para la distribución de la Sagrada Eucaristía.

Los altares, tanto en el ala principal como en la Capilla de Guadalupe, están construidos con granito Sierra White, cortados de las faldas de las colinas de Raymond en el condado de Madera, California.

Los bancos se han construido para dar un amplio espacio para la comodidad de la congregación.

El obispo Willinger solicitó un gran santuario para posibles futuras ordenaciones en nuestra diócesis. El santuario se presta igualmente a otras celebraciones como la Misa de niños, Primeras Comuniones, Servicios de Educación Religiosa, conciertos religiosos y grandes bodas.

Inmediatamente detrás del Altar Mayor se encuentra la réplica de la Última Cena, que esperamos sea una ayuda visual para recordar la Primera Misa, "que empezó todo". El Seminario de San Juan en Camarillo tiene el diseño original de la Última Cena ejecutado por el artista, Señor Ballester, en Valencia, España, fue construido por dos artesanos que se presentaron en el sitio de una nueva iglesia católica que necesitaba como cruz en el pueblo de Limpias en el 1700 Tomaron un tronco de roble y algunos tablones sobrantes del sitio de construcción de la iglesia y se pusieron a trabajar detrás de una lona alquitranada durante dos semanas. Cuando se completó el crucifijo y se descubrió en la dedicación de la iglesia, los dos artesanos habían



desaparecido sin pedir pago. La gente se maravilló de la artesanía y la figura de Cristo, aún vivo, con la cabeza erguida, la boca ligeramente abierta y los ojos levantados al cielo. El crucifijo original ha sido objeto de mucha devoción relacionada, en parte, con el hecho de que los viernes, especialmente el Viernes Santo, se supone que la boca se llena de sangre.

Las tres pinturas sobre la Última Cena, están realizadas en estilo románico bizantino. El dorado románico suaviza las líneas ásperas y rectas del arte bizantino. Estas pinturas son las favoritas de nuestros amigos ortodoxos. La pintura de la izquierda representa a Nuestro Señor como un niño en la Sagrada Familia, aprendiendo el oficio de su padre adoptivo, José. La imagen central es la figura glorificada y resucitada de Cristo, aquí para recordarnos su poder y amor por nosotros. A la derecha del retrato principal del Resucitado, se encuentra el cuadro que representa a María, asunta al cielo y coronada Reina del Cielo y de la Tierra. El simbolismo completo de la Trinidad está encarnado aquí con Dios, Nuestro Padre, y Cristo, el Hijo, representado junto a María con el Espíritu Santo como una paloma sobre ella.

#### **JESUS AT THE CENTER**

Reflection on Luke 14:25-33

These sayings by Jesus in Luke's Gospel about the necessity of renunciation of family and possessions for discipleship are certainly provocative. How do we understand them? Is Jesus advocating some kind of life which pretends that we do not have material needs and bodily needs and relational needs?

Perhaps the best way to understand these sayings is in the simple question: What do we place at the center of our lives? All else circles around it and is peripheral; all else takes its meaning and purpose from what is at the center.

If we have nothing at the center, our lives will be random and meaningless. If we place something other than God at the center – whether it's a drive for wealth or a human relationship or any other obsession – that will shape a life that looks in all its parts like anxious striving.

Jesus proposes Himself as that center, so that everything else about our lives takes shape and gets its meaning and purpose from the command to love. I think of the words of St. John of the Cross here: "In the twilight of our life God will not judge us on our earthly possessions and human success, but rather on how much we have loved."

### **NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY**

Feast Day: September 8

The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The September 8 date helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8.

Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the apocryphal Protoevangelium of James fills in the gap. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child who will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story, like many biblical counterparts, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning. Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of our salvation, and asks for an increase of peace.

We can see every human birth as a call for new hope in the world. The love of two human beings has joined with God in His creative work. The loving parents have shown hope in a world filled with travail. The new child has the potential to be a channel of God's love and peace to the world.

This is all true in a magnificent way in Mary. If Jesus is the perfect expression of God's love, Mary is the foreshadowing of that love. If Jesus has brought the fullness of salvation, Mary is its dawning.

Next to the birth of Jesus, Mary's birth offers the greatest possible happiness to the world. Each time we celebrate her birth, we can confidently hope for an increase of peace in our hearts and in the world at large.




