The Church Structure Continues

The Bicentennial Mural over the tabernacle on the right side of the altar was commissioned for the two hundredth anniversary of our freedom as a nation. The mural depicts saints who have been relevant to the American scene. Beginning at the far left of the mural is Junipero Serra, "Apostle of California," at San Diego, 1769, founding the first of twenty-one missions in California. Next to him is a frame of St. Anthony, "patron of our church," meeting St. Francis of Assisi. The Franciscan way of life made Anthony a saint and St. Francis is today revered by people of many faiths.

The next saint represented is St. Frances Cabrini, the first naturalized American saint. After arriving in this country from Italy, she built hospitals and schools for the newly arrived Italian immigrants.

In the center of the mural is St. Anthony shown as he preached to the people in their own language, a ministry in which he may have been the first practitioner of his time. Today, some eight hundred years since his death, he is still venerated and invoked, among other things, for finding lost articles.

Next to St. Anthony is St. John Neumann, who was raised to Sainthood on June 15, 1977. He was ordained in New York City and founded the parochial school system in America as we know it today.

St. Elizabeth Seton, the first native American saint, was born in New York in 1774. She was the foundress of an order of Sisters who take care of hospitals and schools. Seton Hall University is named in honor of St. Elizabeth Seton.

The final panel of the mural depicts St. Isaac Jogues and venerable Kateri Tekakwitha. Isaac Jogues labored among the American Indians in upper New York State. Kateri Tekakwitha, often called the "Lily of the Mohawks" is the first Indian in the United States to be considered for Sainthood.

The statue of St. Anthony in the front of the church, depicts the saint as a vibrant, dynamic smiling preacher of God's word from the Bible. He was one of the first of his time to use the vernacular and preach to the common people, and is second only to St. Dominic in his renown as a preacher.

In the floor of the sanctuary is the Lily of St. Anthony, representing the purity of his life and doctrine. On the left side of the altar, embedded in the floor near the organ is the coat of arms of Cardinal Timothy Manning, who arrived at St. Anthony's when the church construction was three-quarters finished and his guidance was a God-send. The motto in Cardinal Manning's coat of arms is "Magnificat" – the first words of our Lady's song of joy and praise on being chosen Mother of Jesus.

On the right side of the altar, embedded in the floor, is the coat of arms of Bishop Willinger, who initiated the building of St. Anthony Church. In Bishop Willinger's coat of arms is his motto which salutes our Lady and has links of a chain design to represent each one of the Spanish missions in the then Monterey-Fresno Diocese. The diocese has since separated into two distinct units.

The bells of St. Anthony's carillon call us to prayer at noon and at six in the evening. Hymns are played every day at 4:50 p.m. and church call is sounded every Sunday at 10:45 a.m.



La estructura de la iglesia continúa

El Mural del Bicentenario sobre el sagrario del lado derecho del altar fue encargado por el bicentenario de nuestra libertad como nación. El mural representa santos que han sido relevantes en la escena estadounidense. Comenzando en el extremo izquierdo del mural está Junípero Serra, "Apóstol de California", en San Diego, 1769, fundando primera de veintiuna misiones en California. Junto a él, un cuadro de San Antonio, "patrono de nuestra iglesia",



encontrándose con San Francisco de Asís. El estilo de vida franciscano hizo de Antonio un santo y San Francisco es hoy venerado por personas de muchas religiones.

El siguiente santo representado es St. Frances Cabrini, el primer santo estadounidense naturalizado. Después de llegar a este país desde Italia, construyó hospitales y escuelas para los inmigrantes italianos recién llegados.

En el centro del mural se muestra a San Antonio mientras predicaba a la gente en su propio idioma, un ministerio en el que pudo haber sido el primer practicante de su tiempo. Hoy, unos ochocientos años después de su muerte, se le sigue venerando e invocando, entre otras cosas, por encontrar objetos perdidos.

Junto a San Antonio está San Juan Neumann, quien fue elevado a la santidad el 15 de junio de 1977. Fue ordenado en la ciudad de Nueva York y fundó el sistema de escuelas parroquiales en Estados Unidos tal como lo conocemos hoy.

Santa Isabel Seton, la primera santa nativa americana, nació en Nueva York en 1774. Fue la fundadora de una orden de Hermanas que se ocupan de hospitales y escuelas. La Universidad de Seton Hall recibe su nombre en honor a St. Elizabeth Seton.

El panel final del mural representa a San Isaac Jogues y la venerable Kateri Tekakwitha. Isaac Jogues trabajó entre los indios americanos en la parte superior del estado de Nueva York. Kateri Tekakwitha, a menudo llamada el "Lirio de los Mohawks", es la primera india en los Estados Unidos en ser considerada para la santidad.

El estatus de San Antonio en el frente de la iglesia representa al santo como un predicador sonriente, vibrante y dinámico de la palabra de Dios de la Biblia. Fue uno de los primeros de su tiempo en usar la lengua vernácula y predicar a la gente común, y solo es superado por Santo Domingo en su renombre como predicador.

En el suelo del presbiterio se encuentra el Lirio de San Antonio, que representa la pureza de su vida y doctrina. En el lado izquierdo del altar, incrustado en el piso cerca del órgano está el escudo de armas del cardenal Timothy Manning, quien llegó a St. Anthony's cuando la construcción de la iglesia estaba terminada en tres cuartas partes y su guía fue un regalo de Dios. El lema en el escudo de armas del cardenal Manning es "Magnificat", las primeras palabras del canto de alegría y alabanza de Nuestra Señora al ser elegida Madre de Jesús.

En el lado derecho del altar, incrustado en el piso, está el escudo de armas del obispo Willinger, quien inició la construcción de la Iglesia de San Antonio. En el escudo de armas del obispo Willinger está su lema que saluda a Nuestra Señora y tiene eslabones de un diseño de cadena para representar a cada una de las misiones españolas en la entonces diócesis de Monterey-Fresno. Desde entonces, la diócesis se ha separado en dos unidades distintas.

Las campanas del carillón de San Antonio nos llaman a la oración al mediodía ya las seis de la tarde. Los himnos se tocan todos los días a las 4:50 p.m. y el llamado a la iglesia suena todos los domingos a las 10:45 a.m.

LOST AND FOUND

Reflection on Luke 15:1-32

I call today's Gospel reading the "lost and found" section of Luke's Gospel. A sheep, a coin, and a boy have been lost, and found. Notice the context for these three lost-and-found stories: Jesus is defending Himself against the criticism of associating with sinners. Not repentant sinners – even Pharisees dealt with them - but with sinners who kept on sinning, which sounds like God finds what is lost whether it wants to be found or not. But don't you finally have to repent? Yes, of course sinners must repent for God's forgiveness to be fully embraced. But the context seems more to emphasize the nature of God as a magnet of love and mercy than our squandering human nature.

From Jesus' point of view, any effort to find someone who is lost is worth it to God. When someone strays, God looks for her in all the likely and unlikely places. This is God who is on the road, watching and waiting for us to appear so God can run to embrace us. A God who acts so rashly, with such irresponsible and irrepressible love, may scandalize the respectable, but certainly gives hope to many a poor sinner, including this one.


