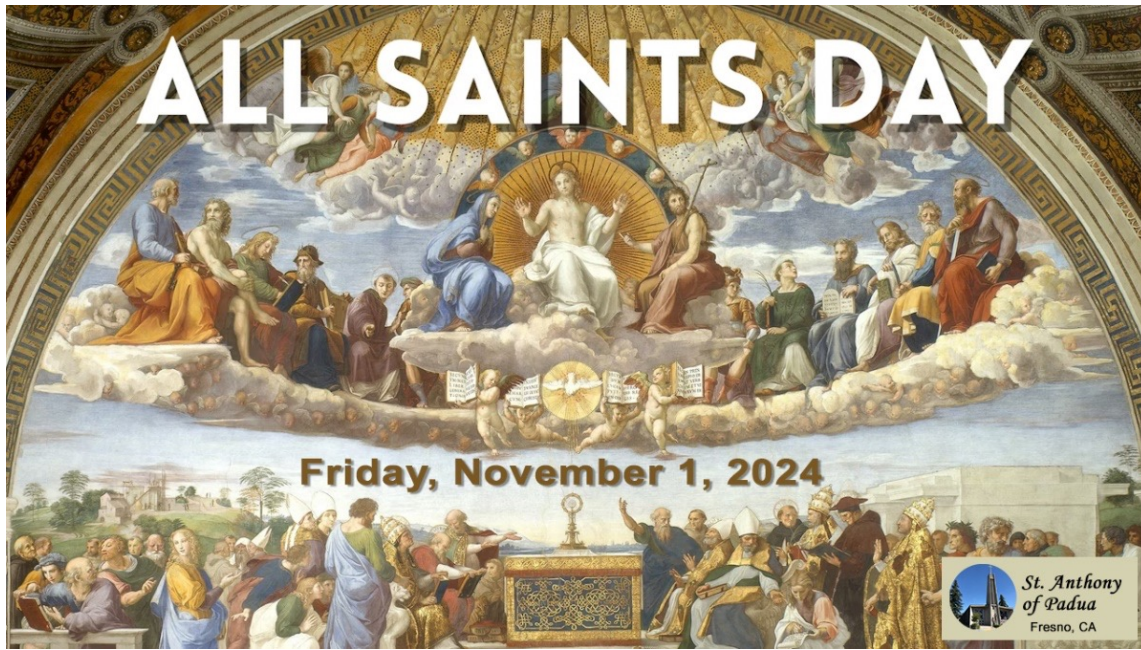

BECOMING WHAT WE RECEIVE

This is our third special edition diving into the pillars of the Year of Mission and what they mean to you personally. This week, we will share about the third pillar: Eucharistic Life.

Since the earliest days of the Church, Christ's followers have lived lives that were strengthened, renewed, and entirely shaped by the Eucharist. Throughout the Gospels, we follow the disciples as they encounter Christ and are transformed. They form their identity in His love, are filled with grace, and resolve to dedicate their lives to Him. Then, in the Book of Acts, we see those same disciples allow that love to overflow into action, making their lives an offering in reflection of Jesus' love—even unto death.

As Pope Francis said to organizers of the National Eucharistic Congress in 2023, "the Eucharist is God's response to the deepest hunger of the human heart, the hunger for authentic life, for in the Eucharist, Christ Himself is truly in our midst, to nourish, console, and sustain us on our journey."

The Eucharist is a call to action. As we come to know Jesus and realize our identity in Him, His self-offering flows through us in love to those that we encounter. We become more and more what we receive: radical self-gift.

Ask yourself:

- "How am I sharing the love I encounter in the Eucharist with others?"
- "Do my actions and lifestyle reflect the identity I find in Christ?"
- "How does Christ's radical self-gift shape my daily life?"
- "As a parishioner, how can I help my community more fully embrace the pillar of Eucharistic Life?"



CONVERTIRNOS EN LO QUE RECIBIMOS

Esta es nuestra tercera edición especial que profundiza en los pilares del Año de la Misión y lo que significan para usted personalmente. Esta semana compartiremos sobre el tercer pilar: la vida eucarística.

Desde los primeros días de la Iglesia, los seguidores de Cristo han vivido vidas fortalecidas, renovadas y enteramente moldeadas por la Eucaristía. A lo largo de los Evangelios, seguimos a los discípulos mientras encuentran a Cristo y son transformados. Forman su identidad en su amor, se llenan de

gracia y deciden dedicarle su vida. Luego, en el Libro de los Hechos, vemos a esos mismos discípulos permitir que ese amor se desborde en acción, haciendo de sus vidas una ofrenda que refleja el amor de Jesús, incluso hasta la muerte.

Como dijo el Papa Francisco a los organizadores del Congreso Eucarístico Nacional de 2023, "la Eucaristía es la respuesta de Dios al hambre más profunda del corazón humano, el hambre de vida auténtica, porque en la Eucaristía Cristo mismo está verdaderamente entre nosotros, para alimentarnos, consuélanos y sostennos en nuestro viaje".

La Eucaristía es un llamado a la acción. A medida que conocemos a Jesús y nos damos cuenta de nuestra identidad en él, su ofrenda fluye a través de nosotros en amor hacia aquellos con quienes nos encontramos. Nos convertimos cada vez más en lo que recibimos: donación radical de nosotros mismos.

Pregúntate:

- *"¿Cómo puedo compartir con los demás el amor que encuentro en la Eucaristía?"*
- *"¿Mis acciones y mi estilo de vida reflejan la identidad que encuentro en Cristo?"*
- *"¿Cómo moldea mi vida diaria la entrega radical de Cristo?"*
- *"Como feligrés, ¿cómo puedo ayudar a mi comunidad a abrazar más plenamente el pilar de la vida eucarística?"*

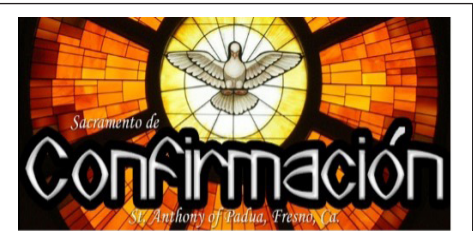

TIME AND ETERNITY

Reflection on Mark 10:17-30

Every human person is a child of both time and eternity. The challenge we face is to live in time while being centered in eternity – what Jesus called living in the world but not of the world.

Living in time, we have to own things, to accumulate some wealth, to plan for the future. This is the way of social responsibility. The spiritual wisdom we gain from the Gospel challenges us to balance and blend the demands of both time and eternity so as to engage in the world without delusion, without the world and its wealth dominating us. Even while we have possessions, we have to disown them, not allow them to own us. Centered in God's grace so very deeply, we see wealth as a means and an opportunity for "loving our neighbor," for extending God's blessedness to others.

Jesus teaches that everything is gift; and that what we have received as a gift, we must give as a gift. Jesus stands long-suffering in His loving look at each of us, asking of us that "one more thing."

SAINT LUKE

Saint of the Day: October 18

Patron Saint of: Artists/Painters, Brewers and Butchers

Luke wrote one of the major portions of the New Testament, a two-volume work comprising the third Gospel and Acts of the Apostles. In the two books he shows the parallel between the life of Christ and that of the Church. He is the only Gentile Christian among the Gospel writers. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch, and Paul calls him "our beloved physician." His Gospel was probably written between 70 and 85 A.D.

Luke appears in Acts during Paul's second journey, remains at Philippi for several years until Paul returns from his third journey, accompanies Paul to Jerusalem, and remains near him when he is imprisoned in Caesarea. During these two years, Luke had time to seek information and interview persons who had known Jesus. He accompanied Paul on the dangerous journey to Rome where he was a faithful companion.

Luke's unique character may best be seen by the emphases of his Gospel, which has been given a number of subtitles:

- 1) The Gospel of Mercy
- 2) The Gospel of Universal Salvation
- 3) The Gospel of the Poor
- 4) The Gospel of Absolute Renunciation
- 5) The Gospel of Prayer and the Holy Spirit
- 6) The Gospel of Joy

Luke wrote as a Gentile for Gentile Christians. There is a warmth to Luke's writing that sets it apart from that of the other synoptic Gospels, and yet it beautifully complements those works.

Jesús enseña que todo es don; y que lo que hemos recibido como don, debemos darlo como don. Jesús se mantiene paciente en su mirada amorosa a cada uno de nosotros, pidiéndonos esa “cosa más.”

SAN LUCAS

Santo del día: 18 de octubre

Patrón de: Artistas/Pintores, Cerveceros y Carniceros

Lucas escribió una de las partes más importantes del Nuevo Testamento, una obra en dos volúmenes que comprende el tercer Evangelio y los Hechos de los Apóstoles. En los dos libros muestra el paralelismo entre la vida de Cristo y la de la Iglesia. Es el único cristiano gentil entre los autores de los Evangelios. Según la tradición, era natural de Antioquía, y Pablo lo llama «nuestro médico amado». Su Evangelio fue escrito probablemente entre los años 70 y 85 d.C.

Lucas aparece en los Hechos durante el segundo viaje de Pablo, permanece en Filipos varios años hasta que Pablo regresa de su tercer viaje, acompaña a Pablo a Jerusalén y permanece junto a él cuando es encarcelado en Cesarea. Durante estos dos años, Lucas tuvo tiempo de buscar información y entrevistar a personas que habían conocido a Jesús. Acompañó a Pablo en el peligroso viaje a Roma, donde fue un fiel compañero.

El carácter único de Lucas puede apreciarse mejor por los énfasis de su Evangelio, que ha recibido varios subtítulos:

- 1) Evangelio de la misericordia
- 2) Evangelio de la salvación universal
- 3) Evangelio de los pobres
- 4) Evangelio de la renuncia absoluta
- 5) Evangelio de la oración y del Espíritu Santo
- 6) El Evangelio de la Alegría

Lucas escribió como gentil para cristianos gentiles. La calidez de la escritura de Lucas la distingue de la de los otros evangelios sinópticos, aunque complementa maravillosamente esas obras.
